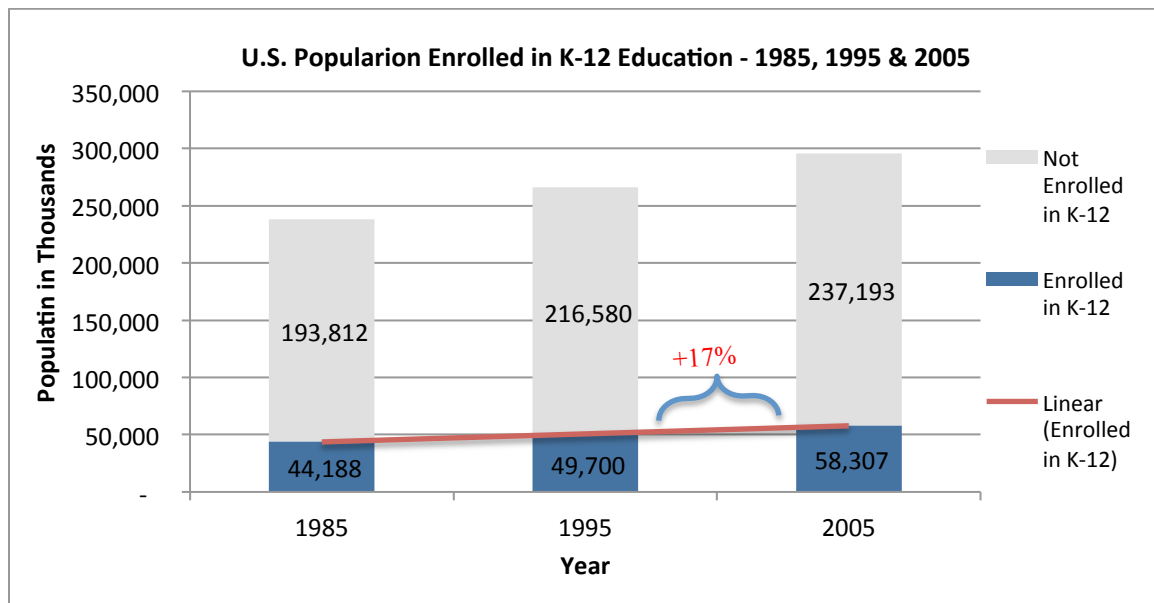

SUBJECT: Analysis and Visual of U.S. K-12 Enrollment in 1985, 1995 and 2005

The estimated U.S. population of K-12 enrollment for 1985, 1995 and 2005 are shown in the chart below.

The estimated U.S. population in 1985, 1995 and 2005 were, 237.9, 266.2 and 295.4 million students, respectively. K-12 enrollment in particular, was approximately 44.1 million in 1985, 49.7 million in 1995 and 58.3 million in 2005.

Further analysis of the three years show a steady incline in both total population and K-12 enrollment. The red trend line in the chart represents an upward trend for K-12 enrollment. Of the three years analyzed, the highest year-to-year growth was found between 1995 and 2005, 17 percent. From this study, we can confidently hypothesize that both the overall U.S. and K-12 enrollment population will continue to increase.
